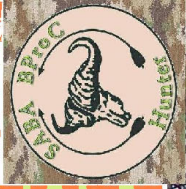
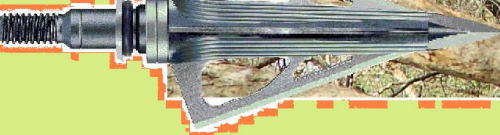

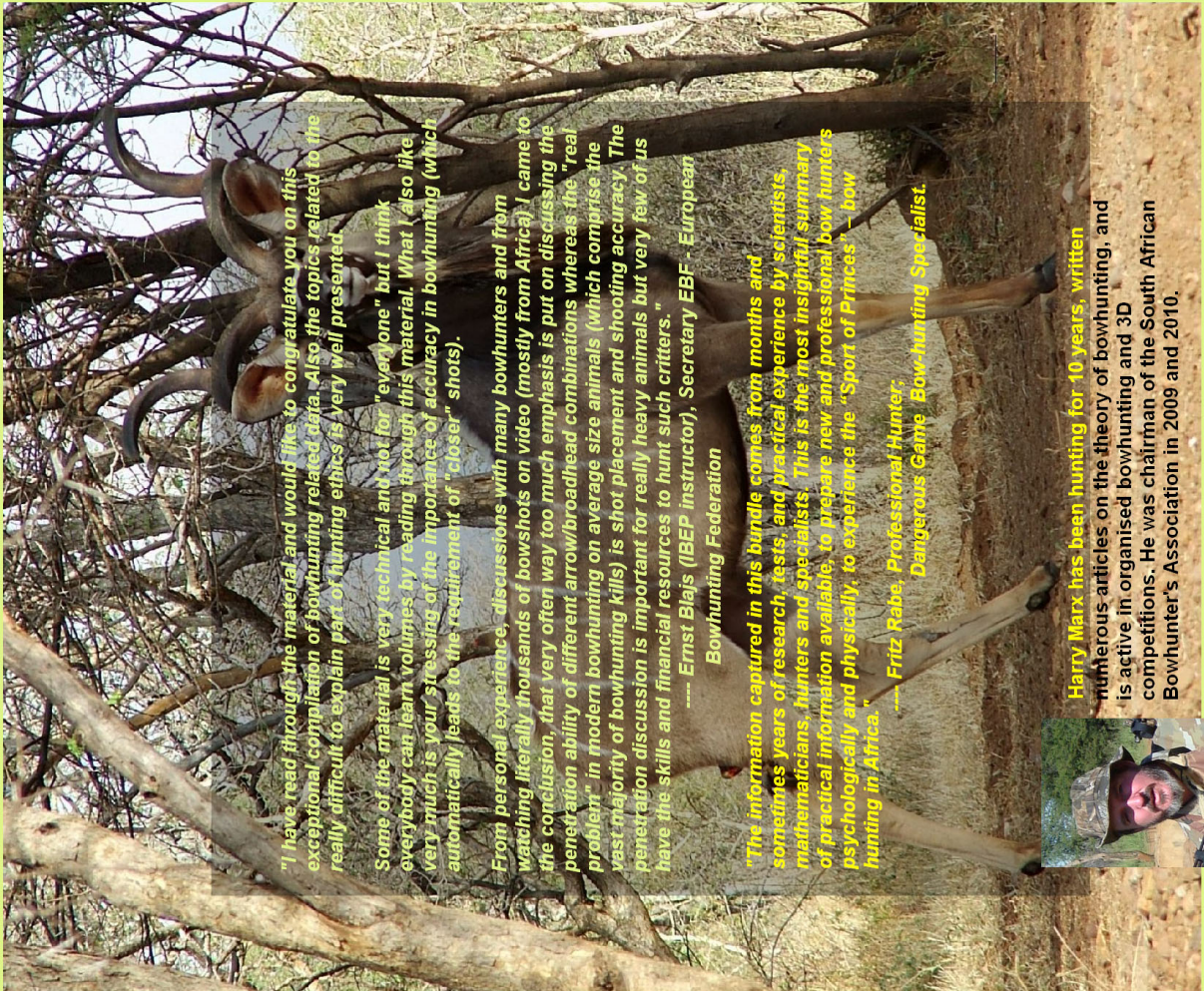

From personal experience, discussions with many bowhunters and from watching literally thousands of bowshots on video (mostly from Africa) I came to the conclusion, that very often way too much emphasis is put on discussing the penetration ability of different arrow/broadhead combinations whereas the "real problem" in modern bowhunting on average size animals (which comprise the vast majority of bowhunting kills) is shot placement and shooting accuracy. The penetration discussion is important for really heavy animals but very few of us have the skills and financial resources to hunt such critters."
